Introduction

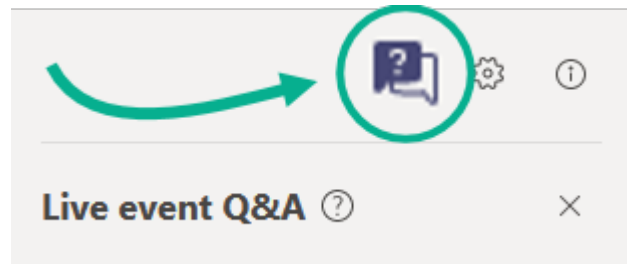
- UK undergoing a period of significant economic and political upheaval due to multiple and simultaneous challenges

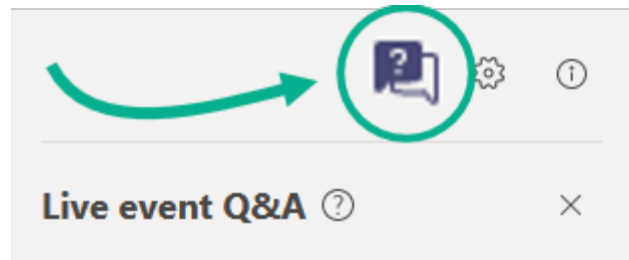

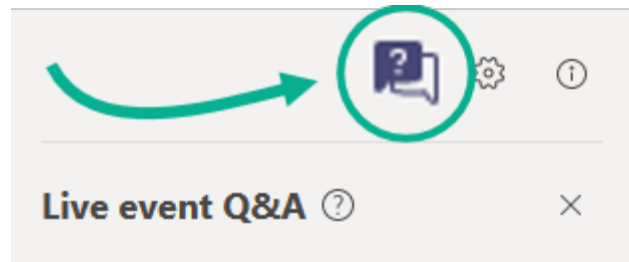
